### **New BILD book promotes positive behaviour**

The British Institute of Learning Disabilities has published an important new book promoting positive behaviour when supporting people with a learning disability and people with autism.

Written by Sharon Paley, an expert in positive behaviour support strategies, the book explores how to promote positive behaviour, the use of proactive and reactive strategies, and explains how to respond to incidents of challenging behaviour and support people following an incident.

It also describes how to review and revise support plans and the legislative framework for providing support to people whose behaviour challenges services.

For those seeking to gain a qualification the book gives all the information needed to complete the level 3 unit, 'Promote positive behaviour', from the level 3 Diploma in health and social care and the level 3 learning disability Certificates and Award.

"In the hands of those who provide support, books like this can make a real difference to the quality of people's lives", said Ann Chivers, BILD Chief Executive. "BILD's good support series is about practical advice to help deliver the right kind of person centred support".
