The 2014 BILD Positive Behaviour Support International Research and Practice Conference

BILD's fifth international research and practice conference brings together thought leaders and practitioners to share their expertise, review the evidence and present the most recent findings on the use of positive behaviour support.

Positive behaviour approaches are accepted as the evidence based approach to support adults and children with learning disabilities whose behaviour is described as challenging. Our symposium and conference will offer academics, researchers and practitioners the opportunity to examine the data, explore ideas, share practice, debate critical matters and listen to eminent speakers illustrate concepts, findings and thoughts on overcoming any barriers to implementation.

This conference will outline the ways to turn research into daily practice and show how positive behaviour support approaches can be applied across a wide range of settings and supports. In particular, speakers will provide examples of frameworks for implementation, including qualitative outcomes from international perspectives.

There has been recent debate about how positive behaviour support is being used and applied, it being suggested that it is particularly vulnerable to corruption. There are concerns that often what is described as a positive behaviour support approach actually has nothing in common with the evidence base of the practice. Speakers will highlight the vulnerability of positive behaviour support as an approach and define what it is, discuss how it can be applied and explain how it may evolve in the coming years.

This year's programme includes practice based workshops, keynotes delivered by leaders in the field and a research symposium. There are opportunities for delegates and facilitators to network, collaborate and reflect on their personal and organisational practice.

As always, the overall aim will be to be better able to support individuals in person centred ways and to learn skills that reduce reliance on challenging behaviour.
