There is now a strong policy focus on increasing employment opportunities for people with learning disabilities. Those in work say that having a job increases their confidence and independence, gives them more money to spend on their hobbies and interests, and more opportunities to meet colleagues and friends. Valuing People Now has made getting a job for people with learning disabilities a key priority, with a cross government strategy being launched to increase the opportunities and numbers in paid work.

Valuing People Team, British Institute of Learning Disabilities (BILD) and the British Association for Supported Employment (BASE) have brought together national speakers to highlight the essential messages from government and employers, together with workshops that explore research and examples of innovative practice. This is a key moment in the drive towards increasing the number of people with learning disabilities in paid employment, especially in work of over 16 hours a week.

The key issues the conference will explore will include:

- The new government strategy on supported employment
- Delivering the Valuing People Now priorities
- Real life stories from people about how to get and keep a job
- The key messages for employers
- How people with an individual budget can access employment support
- Access to employment for people with complex needs
- Human resource issues
