General Approach to Teaching Physical Interventions

A commitment to the protection of rights of service users and workers within a caring environment. P.R.I.C.E. utilises a positive behaviour management approach with an emphasis on proactive preventative strategies. Initially developed under the guidance of the Home Office, P.R.I.C.E. operates from a strong Value Base that supports organisations in promoting opportunities for development and learning whilst reducing risk.

The focus is on developing, awareness, understanding and responses that lead to the management of challenging behaviour in the context of positive relationship building. Defusion, de-escalation, consistent behaviour planning, risk assessment and team building are central features of this process.

Physical Intervention Techniques are phased, consistent with the principles of last resort, least intrusive intervention and the use of minimum force. Techniques avoid positions and holds that are associated with elevated risks and are consistent with current guidance and practice.

Programmes are delivered by Trainers with a relevant knowledge and professional background.
