General Approach to Teaching Physical Interventions	
Emphasis on maintaining the <i>Care, Welfare, Safety and SecuritySM</i> of individuals being supported. De-escalation, non-verbal, verbal and para-verbal models are explored within the programme. Safe, non-harmful physical interventions are taught as a last resort option only, for when all other intervention techniques have been exhausted, and when the individual is representing an imminent danger to themselves or others. However, even when physical control is used, it enables the individual to calm down at their own pace. CPI does not teach the use of prone restraints.
