### **General Approach to Teaching Physical Interventions**

- 1- The importance of creative engagement with service users to develop greater personal involvement in their care through joint working and care planning
- 2- Training emphasises the need to provide planning for a hierarchy of interventions to achieve safe care through the least invasive form of intervention
- 3- A focus on understanding the needs and motivations of people who might show aggressive behaviours.
- 4- Training highlights the specific needs of service users who have a Learning Disability
- 5- Encouraging course participants to view incidents of potential aggression from the service user's perspective, and therefore, addressing the underpinning needs and motivations of that person
