What will you have to do?



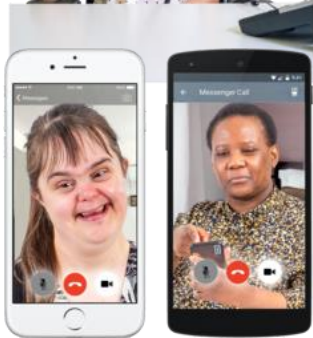
The researchers want to speak to you 2 times during the next 3 months



They will speak to you for an hour



They can speak to you on the telephone



They can do a video call



They can do this by e-mail

What things will they ask you about?



They will ask you about how things have been different for you during the lockdown



They will ask if you have been able to get healthcare



They will ask you how you have been feeling



They will ask you if have been ill



Your name will not be used by the researchers



You can have some support during the interview



You will get a gift voucher for answering the questions
