

What is the ‘Working Together Checker’?

The working together checker is a tool to help you see how well a piece of work, project or service is using coproduction.

At Bild we prefer to use the words ‘working together’ when we talk about coproduction, as these are simpler words and not jargon.

There are five main standards:

The right people with a range of lived experience are involved

People are involved in all areas and levels of a piece of work or project



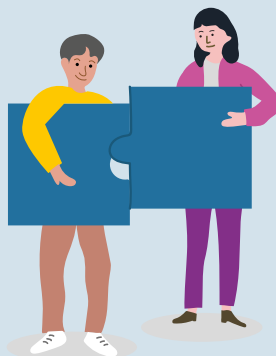

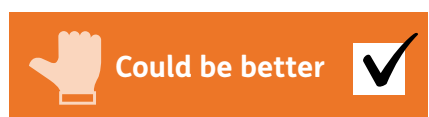
People are paid fairly and in a way which works for them



Below each standard are several ways in which you can measure if the standard is being met.



If you are mostly ticking the 'not good' boxes, you could be causing harm by working together in this way and it is important to make changes immediately.



If you are mostly ticking the 'needs to be better' boxes, then we understand that you are trying to do good working together, but you need to try to improve things.



If you are mostly ticking the 'good' boxes then well done, you are doing good work together!

We understand that you might have ticks in different boxes or in different standards. These should give you ideas about how you can make things better.

As with all things, working together isn't one-size-fits-all and you might need to think about what's right for your project to meet the standard.

This tool should be used in a working together way, which is why we have also produced a simplified Working Together Checker in Easy Read.
